HEY - Did you know? ...

Exterior Paint Phase II Project - This project is progressing well. Foreman's Painting is the contractor executing this project for us. Mark Foreman, owner of Foreman's, can often be met on site managing the project.

There are emails and notices on doors going out in advance to all homeowners involved ahead of any pressure washing, carpentry work, window washing and painting providing pertinent details and advance notice of activity.

Our community street and light poles and our front entrance marquee, will be painted as well as part of this project. This is why we have no bows on the light poles.

Hot Water Tank Replacement - ANOTHER REMINDER - The Board thanks all neighbors who have worked so hard to replace aging hot water tanks. We continue to stress the need for all neighbors to replace them to avoid any potential leaks. Email Karen to let her know when your hot water tank has been changed. It is essential all homeowners work to replace these aging devices.

Front and Back Door Bottom Weather Stripping and Window Seals - If your unit has a front or back door that has bottom weather stripping needing to be replaced that will be the responsibility of the homeowner to repair. The HOA will maintain the frame the doors sits in along with the threshold piece but the actual weather stripping on the bottom of the door is the homeowner responsibility.

Window seals around the window are also the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain. The HOA will maintain the box the window sits in, but the seals and glass parts of the window are the responsibility of the homeowner.

In both of these instances, these parts are considered to be "appurtenant hardware" of the element and as result fall under the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain and replace.

RECIPE SHARE

Homemade Eggnog



The BEST Homemade Egg Nog recipe! Thick and creamy with the perfect mild flavor and hint of nutmeg. You'll never buy store-bought eggnog again! Makes 6 Servings.

PREP 15 MINS COOK 10 MINS TOTAL 25 MINS

Ingredients

6 large egg yolks

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 cup heavy whipping cream

2 cups milk

1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

pinch of salt

1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract

ground cinnamon, for topping



Instructions

- Whisk the egg yolks and sugar together in a medium bowl until light and creamy.
- In a saucepan over medium-high heat, combine the cream, milk, nutmeg and salt. Stir often until mixture reaches a bare simmer.
- Add a big spoonful of the hot milk to the egg mixture, whisking vigorously. Repeat, adding a big spoonful at a time, to temper the eggs.
- Once most of the hot milk has been added to the eggs, pour the mixture back into the saucepan on the stove.
- Whisk constantly for just a few minutes, until the mixture is just slightly thickened (or until it reaches about 160 degrees F on a thermometer). It will thicken more as it cools.
- Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla.
- Pour the eggnog into a pitcher or other container and cover with plastic wrap.
- Refrigerate until chilled. It will thicken as it cools. If you want a thinner, completely smooth consistency, you can add the entire mixture to a blender with 1 or 2 tablespoons of milk and blend until smooth.
- Serve with a sprinkle of cinnamon, and fresh whipped cream, if desired.
- Store homemade eggnog in the fridge for up to one week. Add any bourbon you like for a spiced up treat!
